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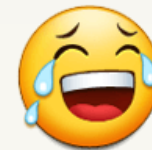

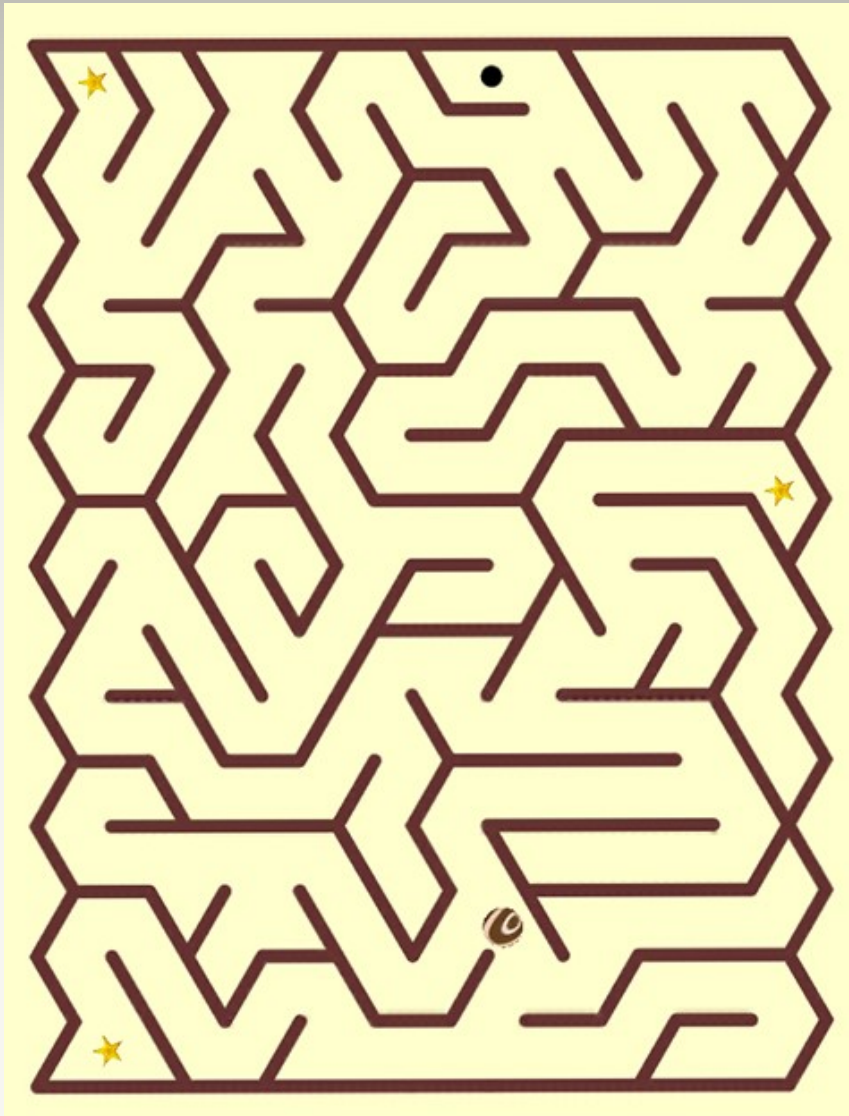

What do you like to do in your spare time?

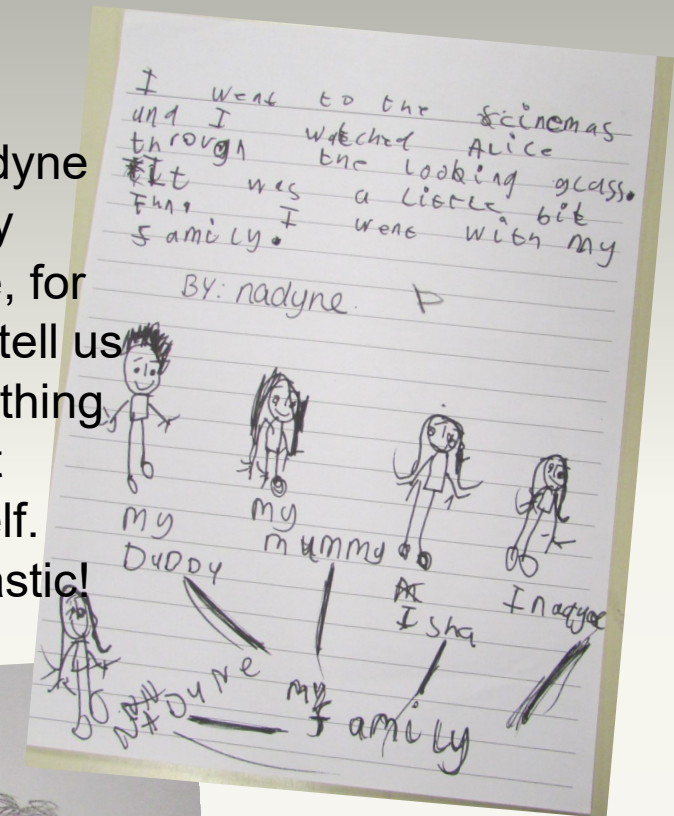
Reading and Bollywood dancing; watching Disney films; seeing friends often and walking my dog.
