Intent

At Sandy Lane Primary School, our intent is to provide a carefully structured, progressive approach to the teaching of French that ensures steady and sustained language development across all phases. Our aim is to nurture confident, articulate pupils who can communicate effectively in both French and English, developing fluency, grammatical accuracy, and cultural awareness. We believe that language learning enhances cognitive development, supports English literacy, and develops global citizenship. Through systematic progression, we enable our pupils to express themselves with increasing confidence, accuracy, and sophistication as they move through the school.

Implementation

Our French curriculum is delivered in four progressive phases:

Phase 1: Establishing Foundations

In the initial phase, pupils are introduced to the basics of French through structured vocabulary learning, sentence-building, and grammar instruction. Repetition and guided speaking and writing activities help build confidence. Pupils practise switching between English and French in simple contexts, with a strong emphasis on accuracy. Activities include songs, dialogues, role-play, and supported writing to establish a solid foundation.

Phase 2: Expanding Vocabulary and Sentence Complexity

As pupils advance, they expand their vocabulary and begin constructing more complex sentences. Emphasis is placed on spontaneous speaking and writing, with pupils encouraged to express opinions, ask questions, and justify their answers. The transition between French and English becomes more fluid, supported by more challenging grammar work and conversational practice. Activities include peer dialogues, extended writing, and interactive games to deepen understanding.

Phase 3: Refining Fluency and Expression

By this stage, pupils are encouraged to communicate with greater fluency and sophistication. They explore a wider range of vocabulary, sentence structures, and grammatical forms. Pupils are supported to express detailed ideas clearly in both written and spoken forms. They begin to use multiple tenses and mood forms, integrating their knowledge in diverse contexts. Activities include presentations, creative writing, and structured debates.

Phase 4: Mastery and Spontaneous Interaction

In the final phase, pupils demonstrate mastery in using French alongside English. They confidently engage in spontaneous conversation, presentations, and discussions across a range of topics. Pupils use grammar accurately and adapt their language according to the context. This phase focuses on independence and application, with minimal scaffolding. Activities include real-world role-plays, bilingual presentations, and open-ended discussion tasks.

Impact

By the time pupils leave Sandy Lane Primary School, they are confident, competent communicators who can express themselves clearly and accurately in both French and English. They demonstrate strong grammatical knowledge, a broad vocabulary, and the ability to switch between languages fluidly. Our pupils develop a love of languages and an appreciation of other cultures, preparing them well for the next stage of their education. Pupil outcomes show progression in language proficiency, with increasing independence, fluency, and accuracy at each stage. The impact of this structured approach is reflected in pupils' enthusiasm for French, their active engagement in lessons, and their ability to communicate effectively in diverse contexts.

PROGRESSION

Progression Overview

Progression: *The progression from phase to phase is designed to build not just language knowledge, but also confidence. The goal is to ensure that by the final stage, students can interact in both languages, showing some fluency and flexibility. Each year builds on the previous one, gradually moving from foundational skills to more complex language use. As students become more comfortable, they can participate in more sophisticated dialogues and present ideas in a coherent manner, using French and English in ways that feel natural and confident.*

Detailed Progression Overview

By the end of Key Stage 2, pupils should:

- *Understand and respond to spoken and written language.*
- *Speak with increasing confidence, fluency, and spontaneity.*
- *Write for a range of purposes using learned vocabulary and structures.*
- *Develop an appreciation of French culture and language.*
