Intent

At Sandy Lane Primary School, our intent is to provide a dynamic and inclusive music education that nurtures creativity, self-expression, and collaboration. We aim to equip pupils with a broad set of musical skills, from singing and playing instruments to composing and performing, fostering a lifelong appreciation of music. Our curriculum encourages pupils to explore a wide range of musical genres, traditions, and styles, while developing their understanding of rhythm, melody, harmony, and dynamics. We believe that music not only enhances pupils' creativity and cultural awareness but also promotes important life skills such as teamwork, confidence, discipline, and emotional expression.

Implementation

- **UKS2:** Focuses on advanced musical understanding, sophisticated compositions, and mature performance techniques, with a deeper appreciation for different styles and traditions.
